Recently we celebrated the 91st birthday of one of our founder guests, Sheila. We had a lot of fun but sadly, she passed away a



week later as her dementia declined rapidly. We have also lost another founder guest who has now gone into a residential home. However, we have had an encouraging number of new people joining as well!

We were visited by the Managers of the Care and Support Team, the social prescribers connected to our local GP Surgeries, who followed their visit with an article on the GPs Facebook page. They enjoyed their visit and said "We found the group to be warm and welcoming. The enjoyment was clear to see for all involved and Katy and her team worked really hard to ensure everyone was included".



One of our volunteers sings in a local choir (The Lenborough Singers) and for their fundraising concert this spring they chose to support our Lyrics and Lunch group! The concert was a sellout with 350 tickets sold. We provided a team of volunteers to serve the interval refreshments and I was given three minutes to explain what we do, so I shared the five threads that underpin the charity and a brief explanation of what a session looks like.

We also had a display board up, complete with sensory scarves, musical instruments and leaflets. The choir master also backed up how wonderful the charity is, given her dad has been one of our guests (the one who has just gone into a home). The audience were very generous and I have received the news that £1000 was raised for us! We will be donating some of that to the Network, to help fund and support the work you do on our behalf. A number of people came up to speak to me after the concert, another couple have signed up to join the group, most of the leaflets were taken, and another lady has contacted me since to ask about being a volunteer. So I think the evening was definitely a success and has immensely raised the profile of Lyrics and Lunch and our group.

Having a cup or bottle of water close by will encourage us all to drink more. If drinking is difficult, ice lollies or yoghurts have a high liquid content.
